

Judging Schedule for the German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada Sept. 11 & 12, 2010 CKC Agility Trials.

Classes will run 4” and up on Saturday and 24” down on Sunday. Selected & veteran classes run concurrently with their regular class.

Check in will be between 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm Friday or **prior to your first run** on Saturday & Sunday. Only check in once. General briefing, judge’s briefing and walk through times listed in chart below.

Contact obstacle familiarization will be available for Novice dogs only immediately prior to the first Novice Standard class of EACH day. Only those dogs who are NOT entered on Saturday may participate in the Sunday familiarization. PLEASE have your dog with you at the briefing.

Please be at the start line, ready to run at the proper time! The judge (during briefing) and gate steward will let you know when that is. Even a 30 second delay per dog will cause the day to run an hour longer!!! If you have a conflict between agility and another event, please let us know and we will do whatever we can to let you and your dog run (we can not however hold up a course change).

Sweepstakes is open to All Breeds and Mixed Breeds 12 months of age or older. Entrants may be shown by owners or agents.

Exhibitors will be allowed 7 minutes to walk the course.

The following heights, in inches, will be provided: 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 24. Dogs that jump their normal CKC jump height are assessed zero faults. Dogs that jump lower than their normal CKC jump height, are assessed 10 faults per lower jump height. NO faults are assessed for dogs jumping higher than their eligible CKC jump height.

Scores are based on dog's time plus 5 faults for each of these infractions as they occur: refusal, wrong course, dropped bar, missed contact, each occurrence of training in the ring. NO FOOD may be used .

All dogs are assessed on their COMBINED score from two runs. Each dog may only run twice in the sweepstakes.

Division of entry money as prizes

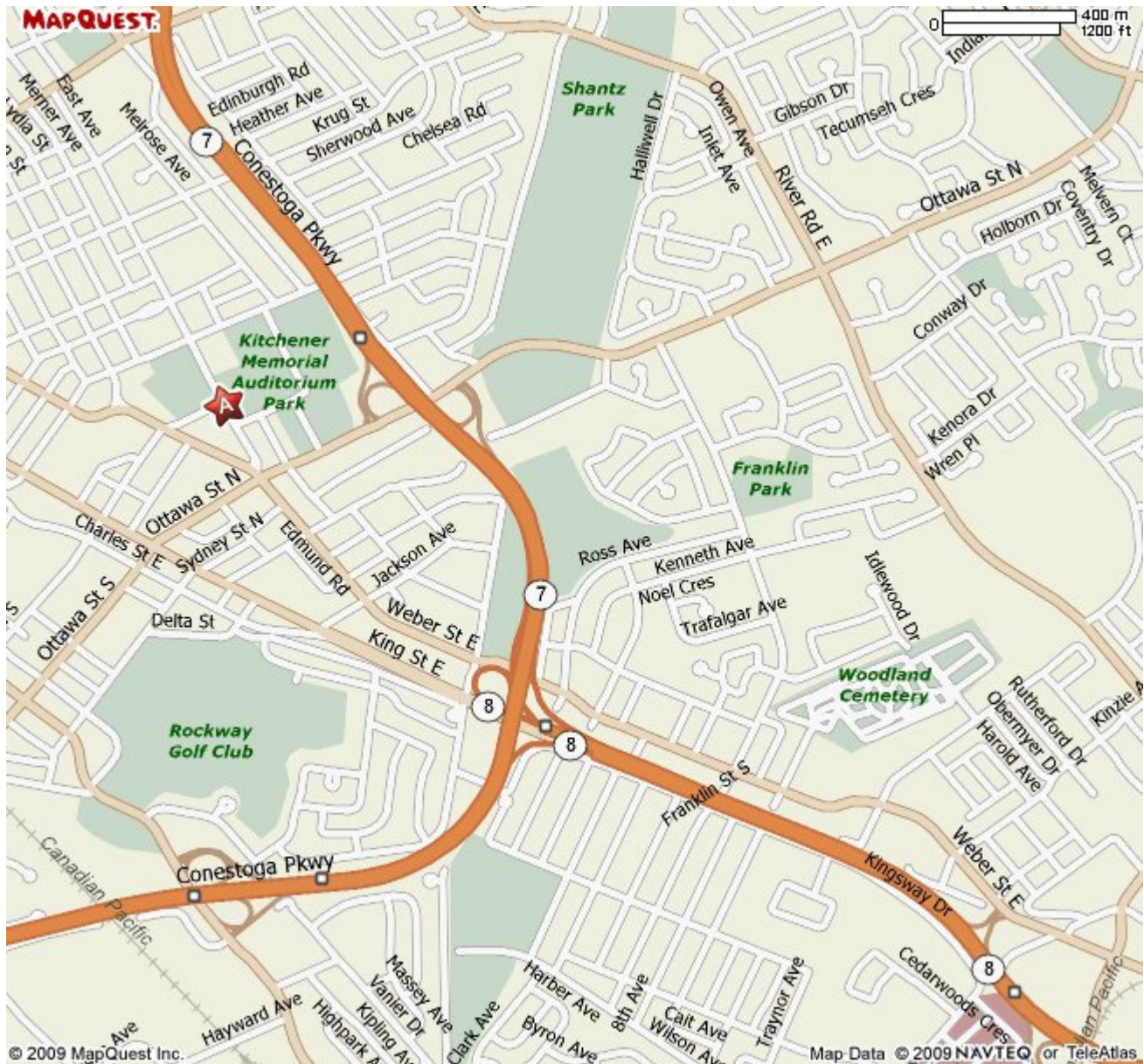
50% of the money will be retained by the club for expenses. The remaining 50% will divided as follows:

Directions to The Kitchener Memorial Auditorium Complex:

From Toronto: Travel West on Hwy 401. Exit for Hwy 8 West Kitchener, follow to exit for Hwy 7 East, follow to exit for Ottawa Street North. Turn left on Ottawa Street North for 0.5km (0.35miles) to the Aud entrance on the right.

From Windsor/Detroit: Travel East on Hwy 401. Exit for King Street East Kitchener, follow to exit for Hwy 8 West Kitchener, follow to exit for Hwy 7 East, follow to Ottawa Street North. Turn left on Ottawa Street North for 0.5km (0.35miles) to the Aud entrance on the right."



Please read the following rules:

In order to make everyone's visit a safe and enjoyable one, we have just a few rules:

- 1) Dogs must be on leash at all times except when competing in the ring. No exceptions.
- 2) Not all dogs love other dogs. Please keep your dog under control and out of other dogs' faces, even if your dog is not dog aggressive.
- 3) Please pick up your dog's waste.
- 4) Please clean up after yourself. There are waste containers for your trash.
- 5) No smoking on the trial site.
- 6) Please do your best to keep barking to a minimum.
- 7) **Know when you're scheduled to run, check in with the gate steward, and be ready to go when the dog ahead of you is in the ring. Be ready to run your dog with leash off at the point on the course that the judge requests. This is when the dog ahead of you is running! If everyone is 1 minute late in running their dog, that adds almost 2 hours to the trials! Three dogs should be ready to run at all times.**
- 8) Be nice to our judges and ring crew. Remember if you want to be treated with respect, give others the same respect.
- 9) If there is anything we can do to make your trial experience better, please let us know.
- 10) Last but not least, have fun! Agility is a team sport. So please leave prong collars and other correction gear at home.
